


Instructions for Calendar Folder

1. Each month's pages may be stapled inside a manila folder, or students may just keep the pages in a manila folder.
2. Each day student will make the appropriate shape (according to the shapes pattern) around the day's date. Hint: If students struggle to make the shape, have them make dots for the corners of the shapes first, then connect the dots.
3. Each day student will graph the weather. Put an "x" in the appropriate space or color it in. Remember, the graph should start at the bottom, and no spaces should be skipped.
4. Each day student will make a tally mark in the tally box. Tally marks should be made in fives. Example – each fifth day:




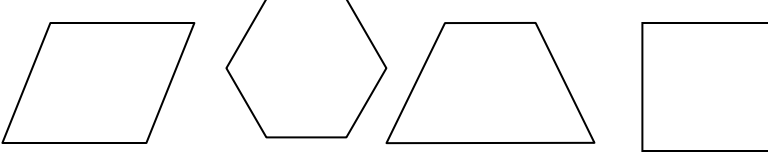
