Legacy Preparatory Christian Academy Nears Completion of Football Field

Legacy Preparatory Christian Academy (Legacy Prep) of The Woodlands, Texas is excited to announce the upcoming completion of their football field. The Legacy Prep Lions will play their first home game on the new field in September when they move to 11-man varsity play. Legacy Prep will compete in TAPPS Division 3.

As the school prepares to enter its 10th year, the addition of the football field at their new permanent location marks another great milestone. The school has experienced an average annual growth rate of over 25% and the Athletics Department is one of the many reasons for the continued increase in enrollment. "It will be such an honor and privilege for our students to have their own football field," said Matt Tarbutton, Legacy Prep Athletic Director.

Founded in 2005, Legacy Prep is comprised of grades pre-kindergarten through 12th. The school prepares students to be successful in college and life by providing a rigorous academic education that is

rich in opportunities. Legacy Prep is a University Model School certified by the National Association of University Model Schools (NAUMS), headquartered in Fort-Worth, Texas.

In the fall of 2013, Legacy Prep was given a substantial leadership gift by Steve and Jane Holcomb, grandparents of four students at Legacy. Since then, the Holcombs have continued to give, along with many other families who are committed to seeing the school's football program grow and succeed. They hope this football field will be a blessing to all who come to be a part of the Legacy Prep community.

Work on the new football field began 10 months ago and has included the installation of irrigation, Bermuda grass, stadium lights, and regulation goal posts. Electrical work was graciously provided by Ben Herman of Wired Electric. First Bank has sponsored a 10' by 18' LED scoreboard for the field. In addition, all the site work needed to convert to a turf field has been completed. This included grading, drainage, pumps, and detention ponds.

Legacy Prep's 6-man varsity team competed in the playoffs in only their second year of play during the 2013 season. The junior high 6-man team finished their 2013 season undefeated in 6-man play for the third straight year. According to Miles Freeman, Legacy Prep Head Varsity Football Coach, "The coaching staff and players are excited about the new football field and the upcoming season. The competition will be tough, but our expectations remain high. This is an important year for our program. We will practice and play with joy. We want to be Jesus Christ followers that play the game the way it is intended to be played...tough and highly skilled."

Legacy Prep offers many sports opportunities including football, basketball, baseball, cheerleading, track and field, swim, dive, and tennis. The school will be adding volleyball this fall.
