Sample Elementary (PreK-4th) Schedule

Many parents ask for a suggested schedule when they first begin co-teaching at Legacy. You may use the schedule below or create your own based on your children's learning styles and your family's needs. Do not feel locked into this schedule! It's just a starting place.

This schedule is based on a 3rd/4th grade off-campus workload. Time needed to complete assignments will be less for younger grade levels. Time allotments below are based on the maximum off-campus workload guidelines for an average student to complete assignments, and are an estimation. Students should expect to spend more time in subjects where they work slowly, and less time when the maximum amount of homework is not assigned. Contact the teacher if your child is spending a significantly greater amount of time on assignments than the average expectations.

- 8:15 a.m.** Wake up, get dressed, eat breakfast, Bible lesson
- 9:30 a.m.** Math
- 10:45 a.m.** Break
- 11:00 a.m.** Language Arts
- 12:15 p.m.** Lunch
- 1:00 p.m.** Science
- 1:45 p.m.** Break
- 2:00 p.m.** History
- 2:45 p.m.** Put away supplies

Suggestion: Complete one subject the night before to shorten your home day.

Sample Middle/High School (5th-12th) Schedule

Many parents ask for a suggested schedule when they first begin co-teaching at Legacy. You may use the schedule below or create your own based on your children's learning styles and your family's needs. Do not feel locked into this schedule! It's just a starting place.

This schedule is based on a 9th-12th grade off-campus workload. Time needed to complete assignments will be less for younger grade levels. Time allotments below are based on the maximum off-campus workload guidelines for an average student to complete assignments, and are an estimation. Students should expect to spend more time in subjects where they work slowly, and less time when the maximum amount of homework is not assigned. Contact the teacher if your child is spending a significantly greater amount of time on assignments than the average expectations.

Night before: Complete History lesson (1 hour) and start on electives homework

Weekends, during the week: Upper school teachers recommend that students read novels and study vocabulary and other materials throughout the week and on weekends to provide ample time for completing assignments, taking breaks, and getting to extracurricular activities on home days.
